Graveyard of the Atlantic Museum *in Hatteras*

More than 2,000 shipwrecks lie off North Carolina's Outer Banks. The dangerous mix of severe weather, shallow waters and strong currents earned the area the nickname "Graveyard of the Atlantic."

Exhibits tell the stories of the USS *Monitor*, the Civil War, pirates, the U-85, lighthouses and the U.S. Life Saving Service, shipwrecks, heroic rescues and mysteries of the deep.

Exhibits feature the state's rich natural ecosystems, the development of specialized boats for the region, lifesaving stations, the seafood industry, and boatbuilding. The Museum offers programs and events throughout the year, and is the official home of artifacts recovered from Blackbeard's *Queen Anne's Revenge*.
